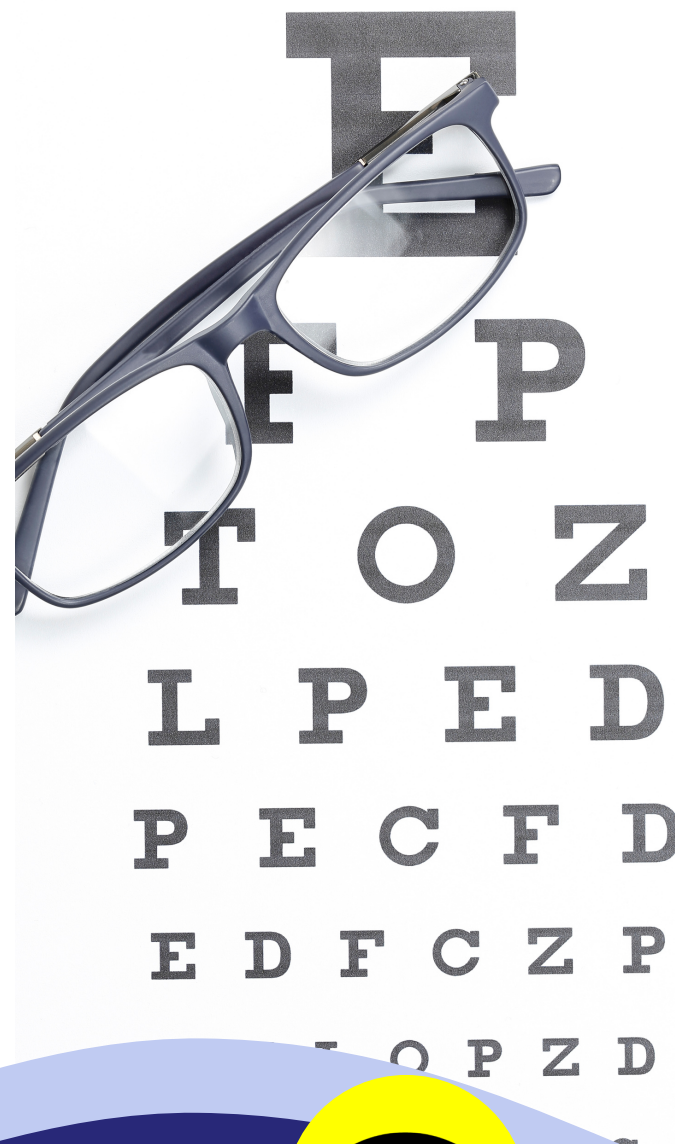
In Morecambe, Galloways have an Eye Clinic Liaison Officer who is based in the Royal Lancaster Infirmary at:

- Wednesday (8:30am - 4pm)



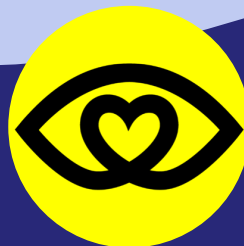
