Local Authority and Voluntary Organisations

Occupational Therapy at Adult Social Care 0300 303 2704

Provide assessment, advice and certain types of equipment and adaptations to help with daily living and personal care. May provide for example, bath and toilet aids, ramps and lifts free of charge. However, equipment is only free if your needs are assessed as 'Critical' or 'Substantial'.

If you are over 65 years old, have a disability or are being discharged from hospital, Westmorland and Furness Council Handy Person scheme can fit grab rails free of charge (charge made for materials only). Personal Alarms

Various companies provide alarms which allow you to alert a friend or relative in an emergency when you are unable to reach the phone. Most require two contacts who are able to reach the user within 15 or 20 minutes of a call. They operate through a button on a pendant or bracelet, which can be pressed to transmit a signal to a receiver plugged into the telephone socket. The signal goes to a monitoring service which then alerts the friend or relative or, if it is appropriate, the emergency services. The equipment can be bought or leased with installation and maintenance included in the rental.

If you do not have two contacts living near, there is an alternative system which can be programmed to call a set of numbers directly. There is no monitoring service but the contact can be any distance away from the user.

Disabled Parking/Blue Badge Scheme

The Blue Badge Scheme is managed by Westmorland and Furness Council. It provides a national arrangement of parking concessions for people with severe walking difficulties who travel either as drivers or passengers. The Scheme also applies to registered blind people, people with hidden disabilities such as Dementia and people with very severe upper limb disabilities who regularly drive a vehicle but cannot turn a steering wheel by hand. It allows badge holders to park in designated areas close to their destination.

National Key Scheme for Toilets for Disabled People **(Sometimes called RADAR Keys)**

The National Key Scheme (NKS) offers disabled people independent access to locked public toilets around the country. It was introduced because an increasing number of local authorities and other organisations providing public toilets felt that they had to lock their toilets to counter vandalism and misuse, and in order to reduce costs.

If accessible toilets for disabled people do have to be locked, providers are asked to join the NKS, which involves fitting standard locks to their toilets and making keys available to disabled people. This has now been adopted by over 400 local authorities.

Toilets fitted with NKS locks can be found in shopping centres, pubs, cafes, department stores, bus and train stations and many other locations in most parts of the country. Around 7000 toilets have been fitted with the NKS lock including those at many seaside resorts and other areas attractive to visitors. Purchasing a NKS key, therefore allows access to NKS public toilets throughout the country.

The scheme is not in use everywhere and a number of local authorities do not have any suitable toilets. The genuine RADAR keys are available to order on line at: www.disabilityrightsuk.org

MedicAlert

MedicAlert provides a life-saving identification system for individuals with hidden medical conditions and allergies.

How it works

In an emergency, vital information is available on the back of your MedicAlert Emblem, which is in the form of body-worn bracelets or necklets. Medical and emergency personnel can then telephone the given number and by quoting your ID number, after clearing security checks, they can receive further important details such as your name and address, doctor's details, current medication or next of kin.

This 24-hour emergency telephone service is managed from MedicAlert emergency call centre. The emergency telephones are staffed 24 hours a day, 365 days a year with trained staff on hand to answer all calls. In an emergency situation there is always someone on standby who can give your vital medical and personal information. All calls are logged, with full details of the caller, the nature of the call and the response given.

How to Join

Standard Membership of the MedicAlert® service costs £32 per year plus the cost of Emblems (from about £19.95). As a registered charity, The MedicAlert Foundation can also provide free membership to individuals on a limited income.

VAT relief for disabled people

If you are disabled or have a long-term illness, you will not be charged VAT on products designed or adapted for your own personal or domestic use. Also, you will not be charged VAT on:

- the installation and any extra work needed as part of this
- repairs or maintenance
- spare parts or accessories

Qualification

Your supplier can tell you, but usually products designed or adapted for a disability qualify.

For example, certain types of:

- adjustable beds
- stair lifts
- wheelchairs
- medical appliances to help with severe injuries
- alarms
- motor vehicles - or the leasing of a motability vehicle
- building work like ramps, widening doors, installing a lift or toilet

To get the product VAT free your disability has to qualify. For VAT purposes, you're disabled or have a long-term illness if:

- you have a physical or mental impairment that affects your ability to carry out everyday activities, for example blindness
- you have a condition that's treated as chronic sickness, like diabetes
- you're terminally ill

You do not qualify if you're elderly but not disabled, or if you're temporarily disabled.

How to claim

To claim the VAT exemption, you will be required to complete a form which the supplier of the equipment and the person making the claim will need to sign. This declaration form is available to download here:
